Presenting the West Cape Service Center located on Agualinda Blvd

The new facility represents an investment in LCEC infrastructure to better serve the LCEC communities with enhanced reliability, storm resiliency, and operational efficiency

This two-story service center is designed to support both administrative and field operations, utilizing a concrete tilt-up and metal building system to ensure durability, efficiency, and rapid construction. The facility features integrated operational spaces, including system operations, offices, and open work areas, along with dedicated support areas such as a safe room, UPS room, and utility-focused infrastructure.

Altogether, the project positions LCEC to proactively meet increasing energy demands in Southwest Florida, reduces the risk of future system congestion and costly emergency upgrades, and provides a centralized, modern operations hub that enhances coordination and overall service delivery.

Project Timelines

The West Cape Service Center is expected to be completed December 2026. Through these efforts, LCEC is reinforcing its commitment to meeting current and future energy needs while maintaining high standards of reliability and operational efficiency.
